This scholarship-based program gives college students the unique opportunity to work at a prestigious laboratory while learning from leading scientists whose biomedical research focuses on cardiovascular, neurological, and autoimmune disorders.

The Summer Fellowship Program is a hallmark of MMRI's dedication to education and training. Fellows are immersed in intensive training involving Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) topics, providing fellows the opportunity to work with cutting-edge tools in state-of-the-art research programs. Each fellow is paired with a scientist at the Institute, and together they work to design a scientific project that complements both the interests of the student and those of the laboratory. The program runs from May through July, concluding with a special graduation ceremony with community leaders, parents, staff, and donors.
